Monrovia Festival Parade Rules and Regulations

Competitions Categories

Grand Marshall Trophy – This will be given for floats that have not been professionally built. 🏆 1st and 2nd place trophy presented

Director's Trophy – This will be given units entering for youth group up to 12th grade including 4H, scouts, youth sports, Church organizations, etc. All entries will be judged on originality.

🏆 1st and 2nd place trophy presented

Presidents Trophy – This will be given to one group based on the overall entry

The parade begins at 3:00. You need to be in place at 2:15, so plan accordingly.

1. Fill out Parade Entry Form online or bring a filled out form with you.
2. Enter the High School Parking Lot off State Road 39 at Entrance #3.
3. Prepare/Finish preparing your entry in the High School Parking Lot.
4. Follow the signs and check in at the back driveway to the Elementary School at the end of the High School Parking Lot. (Festival Volunteers will check you in.)
5. There will be a second area where Festival Volunteers will show you where you will be staged and waiting for the parade to begin.
6. ***Only parade vehicles will be permitted past the check-in. (For Safety)***
7. ***Float riders/teams/others who will be on your float, will need to be on your float at the entrance or will need to be dropped off at the entrance to walk down to the parking lot. Gate #1 to the Middle School/Elementary school parking lot will be closed, but you can pull up to the gate to drop off participants.***
8. Minors/ other participants whose floats have not arrived, can wait by the second check in area with Festival Volunteers.
9. At approximately 2:45, the Grand Marshall will review the parade route.
10. At approximately 3:00, the first units will enter the parade route. Weather could delay this start, so please be patient and listen for instructions from Volunteers

Must Do's

- Toss Candy under hand at the feet of the crowd or walked to the crowd to be handed out.
- Have signage on both sides of the vehicle with the name of the organization listed.
- Be respectful of parade watchers
- Bands are to be uniformed and have a banner showing their name. Each band will stop to play at the viewing stand.

Must Not's

(Doing any of these may cause the removal or eligibility to participate in the current and future parades)

- Must not move barricades or gates
- Throw items during the parade. (As stated above items may be tossed but not thrown.
- Must not do burn outs or wheelies before or during the parade.
